Dec. 2nd. 1907.

Fire at the Anchor Maltings, Bishop's Stortford.

Call received. 4.30 a.m.

Brigade arrived. 5.15 a.m.

Employed till 4.0 p.m. Engine pumping throughout.

Cause. Unknown.

Damage. £35,000

Remarks. Every member present. The thanks of the Bishop's Stortford Urban District Council afterwards conveyed to the Brigade.

July 7th 1908, Sawbridgeworth Urban District Council and Sawbridgeworth Fire Brigade issued a summons to the Bishop's Stortford Urban District Council for payment of expenses incurred at this fire.

July 24th 1908, Bishop's Stortford U.D.C. paid the S'worth.

Fire Brigade ^{claim} & costs into Court; it was accepted.

Bishop's Stortford U.D.C. defended S'worth. Council claim, case heard before His Honor Judge Wheeler, verdict -

Judgment for Sawbridgeworth with costs on higher scale.
Capt. Miller (Leyton) & Capt. Drax (Harlow) afterwards inspected Brigade.
